



Study reveals that hate speech diminishes brain's empathy response

Scientific Reports found that exposure to hate speech leads to empathic numbing and a reduced ability to take the psychological perspective of others—not only to out-group members, but toward any other individual, including fellow in-group members. The study, "Exposure to hate speech deteriorates neurocognitive mechanisms of the ability to understand others' pain", was authored by Pluta, A., Mazurek, J., Wojciechowski, J. et al.

Why this is important: While we have seen how hate speech can incite intolerance and even violence, this study directly examines the impact of exposure to hateful statements on the neurocognitive processes. History has shown that hate along with misinformation/disinformation can lead to stigmatization and discrimination, so fighting hate speech and bigotry is key to advancing equity and social justice!

Study looks at challenges in language brokering in medical interactions in Italy



Another study published in Science Direct, "The changing landscape of healthcare communication in Italy: Perceptions and challenges in language brokering services", by Nikitina, J., & Montenovo, G., investigated the dynamics of language brokering in medical interactions by examining the perspectives of language brokers and healthcare professionals. The findings include various challenges, and potential ways to manage some of them via collaboration, training programs, and regulations for both groups.

Why this is important: With Italy experiencing an important social transformation toward a multicultural and multilingual society in recent years, equitable access to healthcare for all individuals is also predicated upon efficient language and culturally-relevant services.
